

Professional Connections Foundation

The Professional Connections Foundation (PCF) is a program created by the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) with the goal of providing high school students with disabilities the opportunity to build a foundation of important work skills.



A PCF will consist of group presentations on workplace readiness and job exploration, and exploration of the world of work through job shadows, informational and mock interviews, or in-person workplace tours and acquisition of prerequisite work documents (e.g., photo ID, work permits, financial documentation). The PCF will occur during the school year within a 90-day regular schedule with daily programs to include at least 3 hours of activities split between instruction and hands-on experiences.

Students who successfully complete the program by attending all activities will receive a stipend of \$325.
