#### **Approval of Minutes:**

### Wardens Report:

Warden McDuffie begins by stating the total population for the facility is currently 225. During the month of March there were 169 commitments and 154 releases with an average daily population of 234. As of this date, there are six inmates ready to be transported to state with a trip planned for later in the month.

Warden McDuffie continues by stating that on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, the MAT/MOUD program began in the facility. Currently there are four inmates participating in the program and everything is going well.

# **IPP Report:**

IPP Director William McClure begins by stating for the month of March there were 96 referrals with a total of 631 clients. There were also 71 successful completions, 8 failures/revocations and 5 revocation hearings conducted. Total community service hours were 1550.5 which had a savings to the work sites of \$11,242.

Director William McClure continues by stating that treatment court had six participants apply, three admitted and eight being denied. Veterans Court had five participants apply, one admitted and three were denied. In Treatment Court, there were 19 positive drug screens while Veteran's Court had two.

Prison Board President Pete Acker asks for a motion to approve the IPP Report. Commissioner Matthew McConnell makes the motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Boyd. Voice vote was unanimous, motion carried.
