General Discussion Items: See Below.

Commissioners announced that the Agricultural Conservation Assistance Program (ACAP) provides financial and technical assistance for the implementation of best management practices (BMPs) on agricultural operations within the Commonwealth. The program was funded from the Clean Streams Fund to reduce non-point source (NPS) pollution in Commonwealth streams, rivers, and waterbodies. ACAP is administered by the State Conservation Commission and is delegated to participating conservation districts for local implementation of the program. Mercer County Conservation District has received two allocations of funding of \$600,000 each. Farmers and Producers are eligible to apply and are encouraged to take advantage of the program. Funding needs to be spent by 2026.

Commissioners reported that Saul Run Dam was damaged by vandals who attempted to steal a 150-pound diamond steel plate covering the well. Brass pins were removed, and the plate was dropped into the well. It took the collaborative efforts of several fire departments to retrieve and replace the plate. Thank you to the many volunteers who helped in the recovery. The Conservation District does set up cameras at the dams and they will prosecute vandals.

Voter Registration/Election Director Hall announced that today is Cindy Whitman's 30th anniversary with the Mercer County Election Office. Commissioners offered congratulations.

Hall reported that the State may change the date for the Presidential Primary Election, so Pennsylvania is considered more significant. This possible change may impact the available time for processing mail applications, as well as the availability of Poll Workers, due to the Palm Sunday, Easter, and Passover holidays.

The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE System), built in 2004, is not scheduled for replacement until 2025. As a best practice, Mercer County downloads elector files every 48 hours, beginning October 1st through the day before the election, so they can rebuild pollbooks and voter registrations, if needed.

COMMENTS: Rebecca Page, Executive Director of CFWMC, was not able to attend the meeting and she asked that her comments be presented. "The need for food assistance is greater than it was during the height of the pandemic. CFWMC is experiencing 73% increase in distribution of food and need throughout Mercer County. As of June 30th, CFWMC distributed over 1.2 million pounds of food, which is the amount of food distributed in all of calendar year 2022. We anticipate distributing over 2 million pounds of food by the end of December."

DISCUSSION: Commissioners stated that during COVID-19 SNAP benefits were increased. The extra benefits were discontinued as of 02/2023. Many families had factored the extra funds into their budgets and were unprepared for the increase in the cost of food and the loss of benefits. Commissioners requested that people consider volunteering at the Food Warehouse. There is a need for more workers to meet the increased demand.
