Resolution to appropriate funds from the Act 13 Unconventional Gas Well Fund 262 for the Hermitage Athletic Complex Batting Cage/Pitching Pavilion Project. The estimated project cost is \$65,000.00, with additional funding sources from Hermitage Little League and the City of Hermitage. The project falls under the "Community Park" sub-category of Section a1.5 of Act 13. The requested funds will aid in building a batting cage and pitching pavilion for the community's use. The Athletic Complex has six fields that are used by student athletes, from Little League through Collegiate level, and hosts regional baseball and softball leagues, tournament competitions, and state softball tournament games. The project is expected to be completed in July 2024.

<u>Discussion</u>: Fiscal Director Nicki Biles commented on the Complex, saying the fields are well maintained and it's a beautiful facility to watch a game, for the teams to play on, and it is great for the entire County. Commissioner McGonigle said that is exactly what the Commissioners want to hear, that the Complex is for everyone to enjoy, not just those who live in the Hermitage area.
