ENGINEER'S REPORT

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The flows for the facilities are listed in the Engineer's Report.

Dan is suggesting we invite representatives from Plantation Park to our next meeting to discuss the flows for the park. Karen will provide Dan with the number of edu's they are being billed for since 2016. We will be getting very close to our limit at the plant once the SR19 project is added.

SR19 Project – We are at 90% design completion for the project. The required easement from Iron Bridge Inn has been received and is ready to be filed with the Mercer County Recorder of Deeds. There are multiple permits and approvals that are need for this project. These are listed in the Engineer's Report along with the anticipated submission dates. The Water Quality Management Part II Permit Application cannot be submitted to PA DEP until planning has been approved by PA DEP. Dan is working with PA DEP to expedite the final approval.

OPERATOR'S REPORT

The plant operated at 114,000/gal/day for the month of April 2025.

10.76 ton of sludge was hauled by Tri-County Industries, Inc. on 3/20/2025.

#2 pump VFD at the Thompson Rd. station was replaced.

Countryside – Pump was not pumping on 4/25/2025. Replaced old pump WM809869 with rebuilt pump WM547975.

Repaired pump WM809869 with a new stator.

2024 Audit – Karen reported that the audit is complete and provided hard copies for all board members and electronic copies for all entities belonging to the Authority.

We had a USDA inspection (every 5 years) two weeks ago from Mathew McKnight and he stated that he wished all Authorities were as easy as ours. Our paperwork is all in order and reports are filed on time, and our building is compliant.
