# **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

**Hope Mill Rd.** – The resident complaint has been satisfied by PA DEP. However, they did come down to the sewage treatment plant and commented on the amount of debris (coming from the jail) going down to the creek. They commented it also when they did their inspection at the treatment plant. We have heard nothing since. The situation is not improving.

**Environment One Report/816 Mercer-G.C. Rd./Magee** – This is a report regarding the Magee's grinder pump and includes pictures. It is clear (picture on pg. 2) when the excavation was done that the digging was done all on one side of the tank when it was being dug back up. The tank is leaning from the pressure. The tank collapsed and was removed/replaced. Also, when they pulled the tank out they didn't take out the concrete ballast off the bottom of the tank. The Authority has not received the invoice yet for the tank (Tepco) but is approximately \$3200.00. There was Board discussion on who is responsible to pay for this. There will be a cost (Homer Sanitary) to pump out the grinder pump tank also. Dan feels that neither the Authority nor the contractor (Mortimer's) hired by the Authority are not responsible for the damages/repairs.

\*A motion was made by Jerry Johnson and seconded by Dave Swartz to offer to pay for half the cost of the tank and the whip. Motion carried. Patrick Suhrie Abstained from voting.

# **OPERATORS REPORT**

Dan reviewed the report with the Board.

The plant is operating within its effluent limits. There were (2) call outs for July/2018. Switches were replaced on-site for one and the other had a pump sent to Tepco for repair. (31) grinder pumps were pulled and stored in August for those who have not connected yet.

# **OLD BUSINESS**

Aqua Water – Multiple emails have been sent with no response. Karen will pursue this.

816 Mercer-G.C. Rd. – The tank will remain at the plant for awhile until the issue is resolved.

# NEW BUSINESS

**Chain of Command in an Emergency** – The Operator has final decision of what is done in an emergency. The Operator then contacts the Authority. Dan will assist Karen with filling this form out. No Trespassing signs need ordered for the plant also.

\*A motion was made by Robert Gregory and seconded by Dave Swartz to authorize Jim to order the NO TRESPASSING signs needed. Motion carried unanimously.

**Sewer Connection Availability** – David Hall – ERA Realty/786 Sarsi Trail (off Lamor Rd.) – Dan will send Mr. Hall a letter outlining the instructions/costs for new construction.

**Inland Marine Insurance** – Insurance Co. is requesting values for each item of equipment. Ryan from Reinhardt's is offering a blanket coverage plan so we don't need to itemize everything. Karen invited Ryan to attend the next meeting in October to further explain this.
