Resolution to approve acceptance of an award in the amount of \$17,500.00 for the Lawrence - Mercer County Recycling/Solid Waste Department, supporting the Glass Recycling Program for the recovery and recycling of glass containers. The recycling program will provide for the drop-off collection of glass and establish a local consolidation site for aggregation. This award provides the matching funds for the PA Department of Environmental Protection Grant submitted earlier this year and helps offset the costs of constructing the glass bunker storage area. The initial funding request was for the amount of \$16,500.00. The Glass Recycling Foundation funded an additional \$1,000.00 for promotional and marketing purposes, making the total award amount \$17,500.00.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: Lawrence-Mercer Recycling Deputy Director Megan Gahring advised the Recycling Program was pleased to have been selected for this award. This was a competitive grant from applicants across the Country.
